BACKGROUND.

1. Tools, Dies, Moulds, Jigs and Fixtures (TDM) enables all manufacturing
2. TDM sector in SA in distress caused by
 - Skills Gap,
 - Competitiveness decline
 - Lack of transformation
 - Lack of support (hidden from view sector)

SECTOR STATISTICS

SIZE: > 500 local companies involved in direct tooling supply chain

MARKET: Local manufacturing sector purchases > R15B per annum, with less than 20% of this demand sourced locally

AUTO - 50%

PACKAGING - 35%

OTHER - 15% (Mining, Medical, Aerospace)

EMPLOYMENT: Sector has direct employment of > 6000, but it is estimated that 1 TDM sector job supports 20 downstream jobs (Fridge Study 2005)
